



DISTRICT 2 ARPA CASH AID GRANT CONFERENCE



OVERVIEW

- In response to the negative economic, health, and safety impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on local non-profit and business organizations, the County of Alameda is launching a new program, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Supervisorial District Community Needs Cash Aid Grants program.
- The County has allocated \$3.1 million to each Supervisorial District.
- Organizations that have experienced negative economic impacts caused by COVID-19 during the period March 1, 2020, to the present are eligible to apply
- Grants may be awarded beginning April 11, 2022, through September 30, 2024.

ELIGIBILITY

- To be eligible to apply for a Cash Aid Grant your organization must have experienced a negative economic, health, and safety impact created by COVID-19 for the period March 1, 2020 to the present.
- Through the application process, applicants must demonstrate and attest to the harm and economic loss sustained by the organization due to the negative impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic
- Grants will reflect the geographic and cultural diversity of Alameda County, prioritizing organizations operated by or serving populations and communities that were disproportionately impacted by COVID-19
- District 2 will prioritize consideration of non-profit community based organizations first prior to assessing remaining funding and other applications
- District 2 will not consider any applications until after the May 6, 2022 District 2 ARPA Cash Aid Grant Conference.

HOWIT WORKS

- Applicants must demonstrate and attest to the harm and economic loss sustained by the organization due to the negative impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Grants are subject to availability of funds within each Supervisorial District's \$3.1 million allocation
- **Grant amounts can not exceed \$100,000 per Supervisorial district** and the total amount of grant funds awarded cannot exceed the amount of the organization's losses due to the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - Economic losses that were reimbursed through insurance or other sources cannot be used to qualify for a cash aid grant.
- Applicant is required to provide the demographic makeup of the organization and basic demographic information about the population served.
- All grants must be approved by the Board of Supervisors at a regularly scheduled meeting.
- Grantee must fully cooperate with any audit by the County, the Federal government or their designees
 - If it is determined that the cash aid grant is not an allowable ARPA expense, your organization will reimburse the funds to the County

APPLICATION DETAILS

The application is 18 questions long. There is a W9 form and a County Supplier Record form (Form 110-13) attached.

- Questions 1-9 are basic organization information (ie. name of org, name of contact, address, phone number, etc)
- Question 10 asks for business identity (ie. #of employees and board members, business ownership ethnicity, business ownership gender identity, etc)

APPLICATION DETAILS (CONT'D)

- Question 11 asks for applicant's mission/purpose and population served (about 1/3 page of space)
- Question 12 asks for description of negative economic impact of COVID-19 (about 1/3 page of space)
- Questions 13-16 asks further financial questions (ie. has the organization received other COVID-19 funding)
- Questions 17 & 18 are Tax ID and signatures

Do not forget to fill out the W9 form and 110-13 form

• Applicant only fills out questions 4-9 on 110-13 form
